


#### One study programme- two countries --two degrees

# Key facts at a glance

- x The FGU is metwork consisting of over 200 universities, universities of applied sciences, grandes écoles and écoles in France, Germany and a number of third countries.
- × You study concurrently at a French and German university and at the end of your course are awarded a double degreter chelor, master or PhD).
- x You can choose from more that 200

At the FGU you will find almost all fields of **stue**ngineering, natural sciences, economics, law, social sciences and humanities, as well as teacher training, architecture and IT.

- x The FGU backs your stay abroad with €35er month.
- x The FGU offers you the possibility to take part in free online languageses
- x As an FGU graduate, you valuickly find a good joband in most cases work in an international context.

### How does it work?

- x For each degree programme, there is a fixed tandeom a French and a German university.
- x Each degree programme is divided more or less equally between the two partner universities, which means that you will study abroad folests one whole year.
- x However, thanks to the point study and examination regulations this does not extend your study time.

#### Admission requirements

- x university entrance qualification
- x language skills in French and German\*
- x for master programmes: a bachelor'egtee

\* Students with a lower level of proficiency ( $\cancel{R2}$ ) are often supported with intensive language courses during their studies.

## Application procedure

- Applications are submitted toither the German or the French partner universition Germany, applications are made directly to the university. In France, applications are made via the Parcoursup platform.
- x Once the application dossier with CV, motivation letter and grades has been submitted, selection interviews and/or language tests usually follow.
